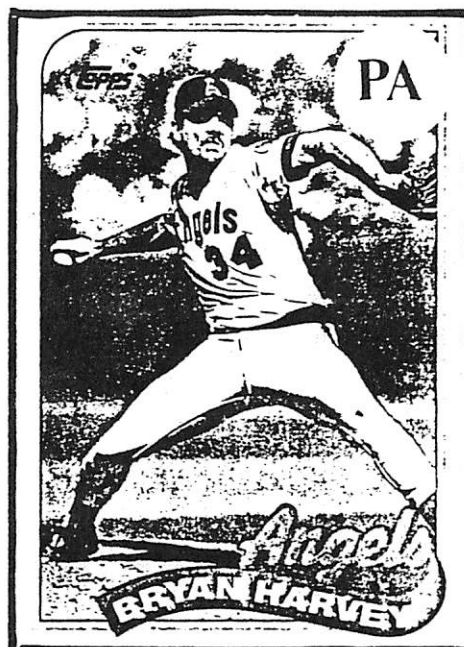

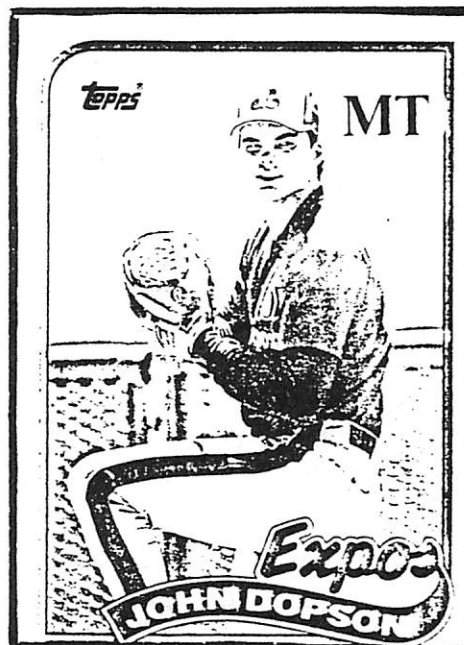

The Sherlock C's, powered by a 54-26 road record, stormed the top of the Koufax and unsealed defending champion L&M in the final week of the season. The C's, managed by Carl Carpenter, combined excellent pitching, a solid-gold outfield, and tremendous power to win 104 games, the most of any American Association club in 1989. Seven Sherlock players pounded twenty or more home runs, led by Kirk Gibson with 33, Brett with 26 and Fisk, who used only 298 at bats to hit 26 homers. Howard Johnson hit 17 to miss the 20 HR club "by that much." Gibson also led the club with 41 steals in 42 tries, as the C's stole over 200 bases, second only to Sir Jeffery. Puckett's 20 game winning hits paced the club, and tied for the Association crown. Don Robinson won 16 of his 19 starts, and two relief appearances to go 18-5 and finish third in the Pitcher of the Year voting. Mike Henneman won 10 and saved 30 out of the pen to share the fireman award. Alejandro Pena gets an honorable mention for his 10-1 record and 0.69 ERA in 116+ innings. Opposing batters hit only .135 against Pena. Sherlock started the year two games behind L&M, and entered the summer stretch behind by three. The slippage continued as L&M picked up another game during the summer series. But the C's cut the lead in half in series 9, and halved it again in 10 to enter the final two series only one game behind. Management turmoil in L&M makes it unclear what the situation was coming into 12, but when the dust had settled, L&M was settled into second place for the first time all year. The C's had a pennant, and Carl his third divisional title. Sherlock bested arch-rival L&M in the Conference championship, then dumped Walla Walla to represent the American in the World Series. Unfortunately, the C's fell short in the "Winter Classic," losing four games to two.

L&M was deserted by manager Dallas Adams after series 10, but still stormed into the playoffs as a wildcard. The team hit 196 homers while nearly scoring 800 runs. The pitching was extremely effective, twirling a team ERA of 3.13. Balance was the key to the Librae. Ten players hit 12 or more home runs, and five drove in 70 or more runs. Yet no one hit more than 28 homers, and no one drove in more than 90 runs. Andre Dawson put up the most impressive numbers (.306, 27, 86), with plenty of support from Trammel (.317, 15, 78) and Joe Carter (.243, 28, 84). Starting pitchers featured Knepper (2.72, 19-6) and Key (2.53, 12-5). As a staff, L&M threw 63 complete games, and relieved in less games than they played (154 in 160 games). This balance and strength of pitching led to the Association's second best record (102-58), only two games behind Sherlock.

The secret for Glenn Bailey's Pacific

Goldeyes was terrific pitching. A staff ERA of 3.11 led the team to the best record among non-playoff teams at 95-65. Pacific simply had the misfortune of playing in the wrong division (and conference) as they would've made the playoffs anywhere else. Browning's 23-9 record and 2.89 ERA earned him serious consideration for Pitcher of the Year, despite allowing 40 home runs (left-handed, you know). Drabek won 18, and six pitchers chipped in with saves, including Duane Ward (15) and Dibble (12). The offense was anchored by Bobby Bonilla (.275, 21, 102) and Incaviglia (.234, 34, 80). Bonilla scored 89 runs and had 20 game-winning hits.

A disappointing season for Clemens (4.55, 15-15) pretty much finished any hopes Philadelphia had of contending in the loaded Koufax division in 1989. The ace of the staff was more like a deuce, especially at home, where he quite simply never pitched well. This offset an adequate offense, which scored despite a large number of double plays (156) because of good on-base and power. Strawberry had a Player-of-the-Year quality season with 48 home runs and 113 RBIs. He and Molitor scored over 100 runs (115 and 102), and Molitor stole 51 bases. Mattingly (.288, 20, 99) certainly didn't embarrass himself. But the bottom line was pitching, and Welch (19-7, 3.44) and Harvey (2.42, 24 saves) simply weren't enough.

What happens when you have the association's weakest team playing in the strongest division? Mark Hellerich doesn't want to talk about it. Pensacola's on-base percentage was two points higher than Tuscaloosa batting average. The Slingray's slugging percentage also brought up the rear, despite Hrbek's fine season (.267, 34, 94). Reardon (6-5, 1.84, 22 saves) is the only pitcher on the highlight film. What can you say when you score the fewest runs and give up the most? Wait'll next year.

Brian Sakolsky's "eliminated" Walla Walla Wombats saved the best for last as they blew pasted demoralized Colonie and turned a nine game post-stretch deficit into a six-game divisional win. Eddie Murray's 9 winning hits, 18 home runs and 47 RBIs in the last 56 games almost single-handedly carried the offense, while Leary (11-1) was unconscious from the mound, and the Wombats posted a 39-17 record over the final four series. Doug Jones won

two and saved 14 in his 16 appearances during the stretch run. Murray deserved Player of the Year consideration for his 41 homers and 123 RBIs. And if that wasn't enough, he led the Wombats in scoring with 106 runs. Rickey (I'll play in Walla Walla but not in New York) Henderson stole 113 bases to lead the Association. Leary finished at 18-8 to lead a staff with four double-digit winners, and Jones was effective out of the pen with 30 saves. The division title is Brian's first. Walla Walla beat Flin Flon in the all-alliteration wild card series, then famed the Baskerville Hounds to represent the Global Conference in the American Association Championship.

Mike Short's Colonie Flames blew out after the summer stretch. A normally strong team found problems defensively this year as Raines suddenly couldn't handle the "drive down the line." The pitching staff yielded the most homers of any Colonie staff, and the Flames lost all the close games against the division's weak sisters at home in the last two series. Wally Joyner had a good year offensively, with 16 game winning hits, but everyone else was a little off at the plate. Higuera (2.32, 19-12, including 24 road starts) deserved Pitcher of the Year consideration, and Mark Davis led the Association in saves and relief points. In keeping with the "also-ran" season, Davis and Higuera, the team's only all-stars, were two of the three players who didn't get into the All-Star game.

Ralph Geiger's Tuscaloosa Crimson Tide surprised everyone by leading the American in hitting ... by 17 points (.281). Only Sherlock and L&M could score more runs. But the thin pitching, and an inexplicable inability to win at home stop the Tide from contending for a playoff berth. Mike Greenwell (.364, 26, 124, 110 runs) garnered Player of the Year, and Burks scored 112 runs, as the Tide played in many high scoring affairs. Sutcliffe (14-16, 3.53) qualified as the ace of a staff that had no stand-outs. As a team, the Tide gave up too many hits (more than one per inning) and too many walks (almost 550) to survive.

For Jim Clayman, the somewhat diluted moment of glory came when his Wakefield Cardinals dumped Colonie out of the playoffs in series 12. The Redbirds had neither enough offense nor enough pitching to make a run for it. The team ERA of 3.81 is not bad, and the offense did must over 600 runs in a tough year to score, but neither was good enough to reach the .500 plateau. Butler got the offense off to a good start every game with a .290 average and 94 walks (.381). But only Sabo (77) could drive in more than 65 runs. Dave Stewart (18-17, 3.05) was solid all year, but was heard to be

whining about not receiving Pitcher of the Year considerations. Roger McDowell won nine games out of the pen, to go along with 18 saves and a 1.95 ERA (only 3 homers ... obviously right-handed!).

Larry Rumsey flinched on every pitch that was thrown: on the average of once per game (and then some), the Coldwater Laker pitch was deposited in the seats (2nd worst in the Association). Combined with 60 more hits than innings pitched, and not outstanding control, the propensity for the long ball doomed any hope of the Lakers escaping the cellar in 1989. Despite this, Mike Moore pitched brilliantly (18-7, 3.27 ... while losing his last three decisions ... and leading the team in dingers allowed with 27). Barfield was the offensive catalyst (.256, 22, 83). Carmello Martinez also had 22 homers, while Pete O'Brien drove in 81 runs, 15 of them game winners.

The Baskerville Hounds, led by Fred McGriff with 32 homers and 100 RBIs, chewed up the competition to breeze to the Banks Division championship. The Hounds, managed by Bill Graham, jumped to an early three game lead, and maintained that gap over Flin Flon into the summer stretch. But a great stretch by Baskerville, and a horrible one by the Trappers, left the Hounds with an 11 game bulge coming out of the summer, and they coasted, winning the division by 10 games. A balanced attack keyed the Hounds success, as five players contributed 10 or more game winning hits, led by Winfield with 13. Starting pitchers Stieb (18-10, 2.27), Hawkins (16-7, 3.39) and newly-acquired Candiotti (16-9, 3.54) were very strong. And when they faltered, Niedenfuer (4-3, 3.33 saves, second in the Association) slammed the door. McGaffigan (7-1) was strong in middle relief. This was Bill Graham's first divisional title, and second trip to the playoffs.

The Flin Flon Trappers finished 16 games over .500 while giving up more runs than they scored. Brandon Rose can't explain it, but he was happy to guide his team to the playoffs as the wild card team. The charm wore off in the first round, as Walla Walla dumped the Trappers. Yount had a spectacular year, scoring 94 runs and stealing 18 bases in 19 tries. Four players hit over twenty homers, led by Alvin Davis (.279, 27, 83). The starting pitching was mediocre, but the bullpen was phenomenal, especially Lefferts (13-1, 1.86, 8 saves), Pat Perry (6-0, 1.87) and Lee Smith (2-5, 2.91, 26 saves). Flin Flon needed a wild extra-inning win in game 161 to sew up the wildcard slot, when a problem with an ineligible starter forced the extra game. The Trappers came up with 3 runs in the bottom of the ninth to tie the game before winning in extra innings. The Trappers were able to make the playoffs despite giving up 169 home runs.

If the Rockford Radar had played all year the way they played down the

stretch, Tom Kopp would have been a happy man indeed. Unfortunately, the club had pretty well buried themselves by then. Still, with the club out-performing all expectations towards the end, it was a happy season. Sandberg was stellar at second and at the plate (.271, 19, 71) and Bonds had a very good year as well (.271, 22, 73). Boddicker went 19-13, despite yielding 30 home runs, and McCullers saved 26 games. With a young nucleus on offense, the Radar could be tough for a long time.

If Eric Rogers' Banff Biffs could find the plate (when pitching or when trying to score), the team would improve quickly. Only Zagazig walked more batter than Banff (586), and only Sir Jeffery, Chicago and Pensacola scored fewer runs than the Biffs (569).

Will Clark was simply tremendous (.265, 35, 94, 110 runs created), and was the subject of trade talks all year long (especially Brian Sakolsky trying to talk Banff out of trading him ... at least into his division). As usual, Viola was the victim of no support (14-18, 2.83, .221 average against).

The Chicago story, Bruin-style, was Orel Hersher. John Gallo's ace was marvelous (19-13, 1.84, 19 CG, 8 shutouts), and deservedly earned Pitcher of the Year honors. But the Bruin offense was pathetic, scoring only 506 runs, clearly the worst in the Association. Dave Parker led the team in RBIs with 58 and runs scored with 45 (though the teams was completely limited with injuries). And considering how difficult it was for the Bruins to get on base in the first place, it is amazing they were able to hit into 150 double plays.

The Darkfyre Daemons, piloted by Mike Landin, awoke from their doldrums and played .679 ball in the last four series to bury their Musial opponents and win the division going away. Paced by starters Greg Maddux (7-2) and Mike Scott (7-3), and Paul Gibson (8-1) and Myers (3-1, 17 saves) An unexpected strong showing against L&M and Sherlock (9-3) in series 10 got the Daemons on track, and they never looked back. Canseco received Player of the Year consideration for his offensive performance. He crunched 44 home runs and drove in 114 Daemons (including himself), while leading most of the Association with 20 game winning hits. Canseco also parlayed 104 walks and a .275 batting average into 110 runs, fourth in the Association. McGwire hit 32 home runs and drove in 93. Puhl and Surhoff combined for 52 stolen bases while being caught only 5 times. Myers ended the year with 32 saves, fourth in the division. The win is Landin's fifth

division title.

In Zagazig, a good offense was offset by an erratic pitching staff. Bob Weisman was the observer of the most at-bats ending without the ball being put into play. The Zilches led the league in strikeouts (1050) and walks (616). With the long ball tendency (150 allowed), the Zilches gave up too many runs (647). Rubin Sierra (.281, 32, 88, 85 runs) led a potent offense that included Dave Henderson (29 homers) and Glenn Davis (.245, 31, 88). Sierra stole 19 bases without being caught.

Mike Witt (3.88, 17-6) led the team in victories, while Cone (2.92, 14-11) led in ERA. Henke led the Association in saves with 34. Sid Fernandez suffered from "Replay lefty pitcher" syndrome (35 home runs allowed).

For Doug Tobey's Mallacha Sharks, a power-outage made life difficult, and fielding seemed extra difficult (145 errors) behind an average pitching staff. The result? a less-than-satisfying season for the TML's newest manager. Galarraga (.266, 23, 85) did his best, and Lynn had a very good year as well (.266, 26, 86). Andres the giant scored 79 times to lead the Sharks, and McGee stole 48 bases as the team was very successful stealing (131 in 152 tries). Mallacha's bullpen was strong and deep, with Alvarez, Terry Leach, Jay Howell and Holton combining for 15 wins and 36 saves. The startling pitching was not strong, but Smiley won 13 games.

Les Fleming enjoyed watching his Sir Jeffery Silver Knights run. The team name suggests pondering armor-clad joustlers on horseback, but the Knights were anything but that in 1989. Coleman stole 84 bases and Ozzie Smith 64 as the Knights led the American with 221 thefts. But speed is no substitute for power, and seventeen teams out-scored Sir Jeffery. Phelps hit 25 home runs in only 293 at bats, and Bo Jackson hit 18, but no one scored 80 runs (despite the steals), and the team fell short of 550. The pitching was above average, paced by Downs (14-8, 2.92), but Worrell just didn't have enough games to save (only 16).

The New Jersey Pinstripers haven't been the same since Rich Perrotti piloted them into the playoffs several years ago. An Association-leading double play total (180) killed off any offense that may have been present, and Boggs superlative year (.347, 114 walks for a .447 on-base percentage) went largely for naught. McReynolds had a strong campaign (.251, 36, 110) but after the two stalwarts, there was next to nothing. The pitching may have been worse. Although the staff kept the ball in the park (122, second in the Association), they were nickle-and-dimed to death for the worst batting average against (.267, 17 points above the American average). Only Pensacola allowed more runs than New Jersey (730). For next year ... the rebuilding continues.

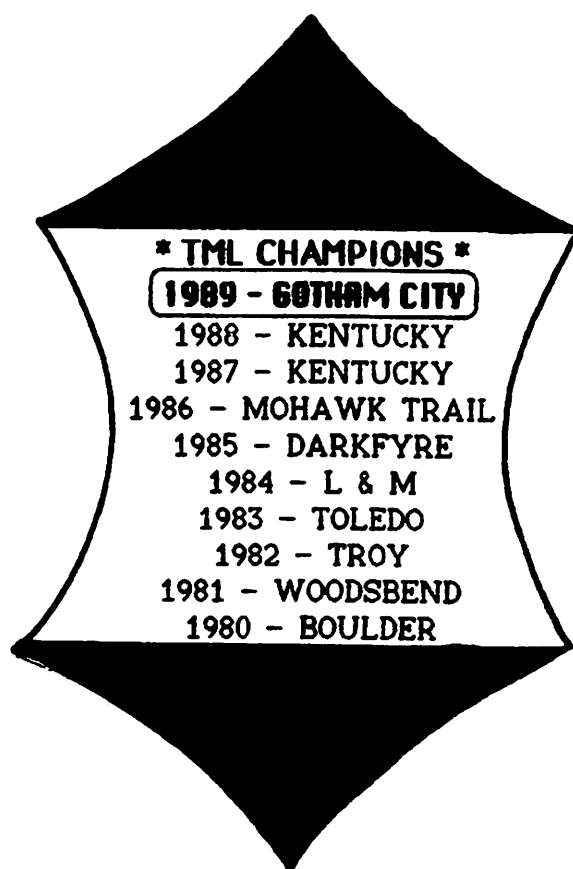

A number of players were on both rosters, including Boever, Pucket and Howard Johnson. Statistically, Sherlock out performed Gotham City in just about all categories (.251 to .220, 8 HRs to 5 HRs, 27 Rs to 25 Rs, 3.98 to 4.41, etc.), except one, the ultimately important "Wins" column. For Carl, this had to be tough, going to the World Series for the 2nd straight year and coming away empty. Well, there's always next year

THE TENTH ANNUAL TML ALL STAR GAME WAS A COME-FROM-BEHIND VICTORY BY THE NATIONALS. THE NATIONALS HAVE NOW WON THREE OF THE TEN ALL STAR GAMES.

IT WAS LIKE LOOKING IN A MIRROR, AS OREL HERSHISER, THE PITCHER OF THE YEAR IN EACH ASSOCIATION, STARTED FOR BOTH TEAMS. EACH OREL SHOWED WHY HE HAD WON THE AWARD, AS THE GAME REMAINED SCORELESS THROUGH THE FIRST 3 INNINGS. CANSECO LED OFF THE NATIONAL 4TH AND GREETED BROWNING WITH A SOLO HOMER TO BREAK THE ICE. CONE AND P. PEREZ HELD THE AMERICANS IN CHECK THROUGH 5 INNINGS, STRIKING OUT 4 OF 6 BATTERS. DON ROBINSON PITCHED A STRONG 5TH AND DOUG JONES STRUCK OUT THE SIDE IN THE 6TH FOR THE AMERICANS. IN THE BOTTOM OF THE 6TH, REUSS WALKED BOGGS WITH 1 OUT AND WAS RELIEVED BY RJO, WHO MADE A SIMILAR MISTAKE TO THE AMERICAN VERSION OF CANSECO, WHO BLASTED A 2-RUN HOMER. THIS PUT THE AMERICANS ON TOP 2-1. MYERS STARTED THE 7TH FOR THE AMERICANS AND RAN INTO TROUBLE. WITH 1 OUT, CAL RIPKEN WALKED AND WENT TO 2ND ON AN INFIELD SINGLE TO THE BOX BY FERNANDEZ. FISK FLEW TO RIGHT FOR THE 2ND OUT. THEN, BOGGS RAPPED A DOUBLE, SCORING RIPKEN WITH THE TYING RUN. FOR BOGGS, IT WAS HIS 3RD STRAIGHT HIT. PUCKETT WAS WALKED INTENTIONALLY. HENNEMAN RELIEVED AND GOT MOLITOR TO POP TO 3RD. ALEJANDRO PENA TOSSED A GOOD 7TH FOR THE NATIONALS. IN THE NATIONAL 8TH, HENNEMAN FANNED CANSECO AND GALARRAGA, BUT SERVED UP 4 CONSECUTIVE SINGLES, WHICH WHEN COMBINED WITH A BOGGS' ERROR AND A BOONE PASSED BALL, RESULTED IN 2 RUNS, GIVING THE NATIONALS A 4-2 LEAD, A LEAD THEY NEVER RELINQUISHED. PENA, MYERS AND HARVEY GOT THROUGH THE AMERICAN 8TH. MIKE SCOTT TOOK OVER FOR THE AMERICANS IN THE 9TH AND GOT INTO A MINOR JAM, BUT INDUCED GALARRAGA TO BOUNCE INTO AN INNING-ENDING DP. JOHN FRANCO SAVED THE NATIONAL WIN IN HURLING A SOLID 9TH, GIVING UP JUST A BLOOP SINGLE TO JODY REED. THE NATIONAL PITCHERS HELD THE AMERICANS TO JUST 5 HITS, BUT THE AMERICAN PITCHERS WERE CONSTANTLY IN TROUBLE, GIVING UP 12 HITS.

THE MVP AWARD WAS GIVEN TO THE NATIONALS' TONY FERNANDEZ, WHO WAS 2 FOR 2, DRIVING IN THE GO-AHEAD RUN AND FORCING A THROWING ERROR THAT LED TO AN INSURANCE RUN.
